# GOVERNOR BROWN'S EXECUTIVE ORDER

- TWO-WEEK FREEZE
- TAKE OUT ONLY FOR DINING
- GYMS, INDOOR/OUTDOOR RECREATION FACILITIES CLOSED
- 75% CAPACITY FOR GROCERY, PHARMACY, RETAIL
- BUSINESSES REQUIRED TO ALLOW EMPLOYEES TO WORK FROM
  HOME
- SOCIAL GATHERINGS LIMITED TO SIX PEOPLE TOTAL/ FAITH GATHERINGS TO 25 PEOPLE INSIDE
- 14-DAY QUARANTINE REQUIRED WHEN YOU TRAVEL OUT OF STATE

# HOW DOES THIS IMPACT THE DALLAS SCHOOL DISTRICT?

- STUDENTS OR STAFF WHO TRAVEL OUT OF STATE FOR NON-ESSENTIAL REASONS WILL BE REQUIRED TO QUARANTINE FOR 14 DAYS PRIOR TO ENTERING ANY DSD BUILDINGS
- IF YOUR STUDENT ATTENDS SCHOOL UNDER LIMITED IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION AND TRAVELS OUT OF STATE OVER THANKSGIVING, THEY WILL BE REQUIRED TO QUARANTINE FOR 14 DAYS UPON RETURNING TO OREGON
- ALLOWABLE REASONS FOR TRAVELING OUT OF STATE INCLUDE:
  - WORK AND STUDY
  - CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE SUPPORT
  - HEALTH AND IMMEDIATE MEDICAL CARE
  - SAFETY AND SECURITY
  - ECONOMIC SUPPLY CHAINS

#### LESS COMMON SYMPTOMS:

- Muscle pain
- . Screthroat
- Nausea or vomiting
- . Diarrhea
- Fatigue Headache
- Congestion/ runny nose
- \* Fever is 100.4 mouth or ear \* Fever is 99.4 for chead

Case Count: 194 Cases Per 100,000: 233.9 County Test Positivity: 10.7%

#### On Site or Hybrid Learning Models Allowed

#### **County Metrics**

Case rate: Less than 50 cases per 100,00 in population in the preceding 14 days.

Test positivity rate: less than 5% for the county in 14 preceding days.

K-12 hybrid instruction can resume in this area.

#### On Site or Hybrid Learning Models Allowed

#### **County Metrics**

Case rate falls between 50 and 100 cases per 100,000 population in the preceding 14 days. Test positivity rate: 5-8% in the preceding 14 days.

Start with K-3 instruction and move to 4-5 with success and limited virus spread.

#### **Consider Transition to Distance Learning**

Work with local health authority to determine need. **County Metrics** 

Case rate falls between 100 and 200 cases per 100,000 in population in the preceding 14 days.

Test positivity rate: 8-10% in the preceding 14 days.

Polk County is currently here with 106.1 cases per 100,000 and 6% positivity rate.

#### Implement Distance Learning with Limited In-Person Instruction

#### **County Metrics**

Case rate is greater than 200 cases per 100,000 in population in the preceding 14 days.

Test positivity rate: Greater than 10% in preceding 14 days.

Stay in comprehensive distance learning K-12.

## HOW DOES THIS IMPACT DSD ATHLETICS?

- PROHIBITION ON ALL K-12 SCHOOL SPORTS INDOORS, INCLUDING CONDITIONING, TRAINING AND COMPETITION.
- OUTDOOR TRAINING, CONDITIONING AND COMPETITION IS STILL ALLOWED FOR NON-CONTACT AND MINIMAL/MEDIUM CONTACT SPORTS FOR SCHOOLS UTILIZING ON-SITE, HYBRID, OR COMPREHENSIVE DISTANCE LEARNING.
- OUTDOOR TRAINING AND CONDITIONING IS STILL ALLOWED FOR FULL-CONTACT SPORTS FOR SCHOOLS UTILIZING
  ON-SITE, HYBRID, OR COMPREHENSIVE DISTANCE LEARNING PROVIDED THEY DON'T INCLUDE FULL CONTACT OF ANY
  KIND.
- MASK/FACE COVERINGS MUST BE WORN WHEN ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING IN AN OUTDOOR SPORT.
- CLOSURE OF INDOOR AND OUTDOOR SWIMMING POOLS, LICENSED SPA POOLS AND INDOOR SPORT COURTS.
- LIMIT THE MAXIMUM CAPACITY FOR EACH OUTDOOR K-12 SCHOOL SPORTING EVENT TO 50 PEOPLE. MAINTAIN
  PHYSICAL DISTANCING OF AT LEAST SIX (6) FEET PER PERSON.
- INDIVIDUALS MUST SELF-QUARANTINE FOR 14 DAYS UPON RETURN TO OREGON IF THEY HAVE TRAVELED OUT OF
  STATE FOR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES OR AS PART OF AN ATHLETIC TRAVELING TEAM.
